#### **Impact Evaluation**

High quality pupil engagement in the playground due to coaches & behaviour mentor leading team games

100% engagement for Forest School and all children able to access due to correct clothing available .

Development of children's core strength, balance and concentration as a result of yoga sessions All children able to continue active playtimes and team games due to covid complaint resourcing Playground markings used by all pupils including those with physical difficulties. Team games increased due to the markings being available football and cricket. Track for cycles allows constant access to biking

2 full-time equivalent staff are now currently employed and trained in Forest School and Club sports.
